Circus a sight to see at Cockburn Central

The circus is coming to town – or to LandCorp’s Cockburn Central development, to be precise.

Balancing and trapeze acts, acrobats, dancers and clowns from Circus Joseph Ashton will entertain crowds for one month from Friday, 26 March.

LandCorp Business Manager Juliet Honour said the impressive red-and-white big top would stand out at the Cockburn Central town centre site, which over coming years will be a mix of residential, retail and business developments.

“While it is here the circus will create a buzz and increase entertainment options for local residents and nearby business operators. Our long term aim for Cockburn Central is to create an exciting community which has activities and services with the added benefit of being easily accessible to the City and Mandurah,” she said.

The circus tent will be set up opposite the Cockburn Central train station, near the corner of North Lake Road and Signal Terrace, on a site provided by LandCorp.

Complementary tickets will be given to Cockburn Central residents and the Cockburn Youth Centre.

Circus founder Joseph Ashton said the traditional circus show highlighted the skills of a range of performers and would captivate audiences of all ages for over two hours.

“The show is interactive and that is perhaps its most appealing feature – the audiences walk away raving about how they felt a part of the circus,” he said.

Cockburn Central is conveniently located for people travelling via the Kwinana Freeway or using public transport and is just 15 minutes from the Perth CBD on the train.

The final show will be performed on Sunday, 26 April, at 12pm.
